





Visit the **Scotland galleries** to complete this trail.

Find out about the history of money and why people hid their money during Medieval times. Learn about the importance of banking to the Scottish economy from the 17th century right up to the present day. Learn some interesting job facts and find out where to go for more information.

Start on Level 1 – Kingdom of the Scots	<b>3.</b> Find Mary's gold and silver coins in the big case. What do they mark?
Find the doorway dated 1672, near the cannons. Turn first left after walking through this doorway. Go to the cases of coins.	
<b>1.</b> Find the seal press next to the seal matrix of Solomon. What do you think it might have been used for?	
2. What did people do with their money during Medieval times when there were no banks?	There are lots of fantastic job opportunities for people who want to work with money



**3.** Look at the banknotes on display in the two cases.

Write down two differences between banknotes from the 18th century compared with those from the 19th and 20th centuries?

## Go to Level 3 - Scotland Transformed

Go back to Hawthornden Court where you will see a big staircase to Level 3, Scotland Transformed. Turn right at the thatched house and look for the hanging sign above you on your right hand side with The National Bank of Scotland Limited on it. Turn right and go to the glass cases.

**1.** Which year was the Bank of Scotland founded?

**2.** Find the picture of John Campbell. He worked at the Royal Bank of Scotland during the 18th century. Below the picture are two banknotes produced by the bank.

Write down one difference between these banknotes.

**4.** What was so important about the items that the papermaking frame produced?





Return to the thatched house at the end of this gallery and walk up the steps to Level 5. Turn right and you will see the stairs to Level 6.

Walk to the opposite end of the Gallery until you reach the Finance sign on the back wall.

**2.** Name the financial institution which uses a phone in its advertising.



**3.** By the 1980s Finance had become one of Scotland's major service industries. By 2007, how much did the industry contribute to the Scottish economy?



**4.** Have a look at the credit cards in the case. What innovative idea did the Bank of Scotland have when it produced these cards?
