




Welcome

Explore life in the countryside at our museum, historic farmhouse and working farm.

Explore life on the farm

Bring your wellies and get ready to enjoy the museum inside and out. Explore the museum galleries (see plan overleaf) then set off for the farm. A walk from the museum to the farm takes about 10 minutes on paths overlooking the fields and hedgerows, or take a ride on our Farm Explorer tractor-trailer – book your free ticket at the museum ticket desk.

At the farm steading, look out for our pigs, sheep, hens, cows, Clydesdale horses and resident farm cats. Then visit the Georgian farmhouse and explore the bothy, outbuildings and kitchen garden. We ask that you don't pet the farm animals, including our farm cats. Thank you.

Inside the museum


How have rural home life, farming and the landscape changed in 300 years? Visit the museum galleries to uncover the story of Scotland's rural history.


See collections of tools, models and machinery, discover stories of life on the land, and explore the great outdoors in *Garden Detectives*, our interactive family friendly gallery.
