Fashion Photography

S5–S6 Higher Photography or Art & Design

National Museum of Scotland

This 1.5 day workshop is spread over 2 consecutive weeks:

26 – 30 Sep (at Museum) then
3 – 7 Oct (at Stills)

Learn the skills you need to prepare for your own fashion shoot with one day at the museum and an afternoon at Stills: Centre for Photography. Work with professional photographers from Stills to explore approaches to lighting, composition and styling.

Pupils will:

- Be given opportunities to shape their own learning through selecting the location of their shoot and the styling of their models
- Have unique access to a range of costumes and props from the museum handling collections to use in their photographs
- Become familiar with the latest photography equipment, provided by Stills, such as Digital SLR cameras (Canon 600D) and studio lighting equipment (Bowens Flash units)
- Work with a professional photographer to create studio and environmental shots
- Develop ICT skills using iMac workstations with Adobe Photoshop (CS6) and Lightroom
- Engage with future career opportunities by working with experienced photographers and in professional environments
- Have their final work curated and exhibited at the National Museum of Scotland, be invited to the opening, and receive their printed photograph afterwards


Included in the box are:

My World of Work Live! inspires young people's interest in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) careers.

For primary 7 to S3 pupils, its interactive activities are hands-on and engaging, empowering young people to make informed decisions about their future. Museum objects are used to spark discussion on the wealth of opportunity STEM careers offer, and challenge young people to see where STEM subjects could take them.

Before and after their visit, pupils can go to myworldofwork.co.uk to find information and tools to help them explore a range of careers across a variety of industries. You'll also find support resources to help pupils make the most of their visit and continue learning back in the classroom. You can also use self-led STEM trail sheets during your visit, which will guide your pupils round the museum galleries and encourage them to think about their skills and the jobs available to them now, and in the future.
