Rip It Up: The Story of Scottish Pop

Discover the story of Scottish pop music as we take you on a musical journey from the 1950s to the present day. From the days of the dancehalls to the emergence of pop in an explosion of colour in the 60s, through the 70s and New Wave, *Rip It Up* features global stars and independent local heroes from pop's early days right up to today's outstanding newcomers.

Rip It Up: Scottish Popular Music Study Day

Introduce your pupils to Scottish popular music in this immersive day uncovering the range of social and cultural influences on artists, songs and musical genres.

Pupils will:

- Discover the history of Scottish pop music from the 1950s to present day in the lively *Rip It Up* exhibition.
- The walking tour of Edinburgh's Old Town traces the people, venues and gigs that made the city's music. Led by journalists and musicians with long experience of Edinburgh's music scene.
- Explore the world-class displays of musical instruments at St Cecilia's Hall, Scotland's oldest concert venue. Meet the curator to find out about this unique collection.

Rip It Up: Portrait Photography

S5–S6 Higher Photography or Art & Design

This 1.5 day workshop is spread over two consecutive weeks:

Mon 24–Thu 27 Sep & Mon 1–Thu 4 Oct 2018

Learn the skills you need to prepare for your own photo shoot with one day at the museum and an afternoon at Stills: Centre for Photography. Work with professional photographers from Stills to explore approaches to lighting, composition and styling and create your own album cover, inspired by *Rip It Up*.

Pupils will:

- Shape their own learning through selecting the location of their shoot and the styling of their models.
- Be invited to bring along their own choice of props and costumes in response to the particular style of music they are inspired by.
- Become familiar with the latest photography equipment, provided by Stills, such as Digital SLR cameras (Canon 600D) and studio lighting equipment (Bowens Flash units).
- Work with a professional photographer to create studio and environmental shots.
- Develop ICT skills using iMac workstations with Adobe Photoshop (CC) and Lightroom.
- Engage with future career opportunities by working with experienced photographers and in professional environments.
- Have their album cover displayed at the museum and receive their printed photograph afterwards.

This new teacher-led handling box will allow pupils to discover more about Material Science through hands-on and gallery-based activities which explore both familiar and unusual objects from across the museum.

- Explore a range of traditional and nontraditional materials used in a selection of museum objects and examine how their individual properties have made them uniquely suited to their purpose.
- Examine samples of new and emerging materials and explore how their properties could be used in current and future technologies.
- Compare the design of everyday objects to discover how social, environmental and technological changes have influenced their development.
