This building opened in 1866 when this hall was only partly finished.


Stand in the middle of the floor. Look around you. Remember to look up too!

This part of the museum was opened in 1998 and has a very different design.


Can you name three ways that this design is different to the Grand Gallery?


Go to Level 3 – Scotland Transformed

Who designed this building?


Why would it be useful to make a model like this?


How was it heated?
