

Must see:

Hangar 4, Concorde Experience

In the *Concorde Experience* exhibition we can offer you virtual access to the Concorde cockpit and also see seats and a toilet from the aircraft. In the *Theatre* you can see a 12 minute film about the aeroplane including footage of it

in service and interviews with crew and passengers. The original design of our airliners means that access to them is not easy. Concorde is very narrow to allow it to travel at supersonic speeds.



Access Information:

The *Aviator Café* is fully accessible and is reached through the short link corridor from the Concorde Experience.

Accessible toilets are available in *Hangar 4, Concorde Experience, Fantastic Flight* and the *Education Centre*.

When you get into *Fantastic Flight* it is best to go through the door on your right and go round the building anti-clockwise.




Must see:

Be sure to have a go on the R34 simulator where you will guide the giant airship into the First World War site.

Did you know?

The National Museum of Flight occupies one of the best-preserved Second World War airfields and is a Scheduled Ancient monument: a site of historical value. In the Second World War RAF East Fortune had three runways arranged in an 'A' shape. This is a typical lay out for a bomber station, though the site was mainly used for training.

The museum is just one small part of this historic airfield and lies within the 'technical site' where aircraft and equipment were repaired and maintained. If you want to learn more about the site's history take the *Airfield Explorer* to the *Fortunes of War* Exhibition.



Must see:

In *Hangar 2, Military aviation* the mezzanine platform allows views over the military aircraft such as Panavia Tornado and is accessible via lift. It's also a great viewing point for the dramatic film show that brings them to life.

Don't miss:

When you leave *Fantastic Flight* turn left out of the building and then left again at the T-junction so that you don't miss the *Parachute Store*. This building is restored to its original World War Two condition.
