There are five items from New Caledonia.

The collection includes three wooden clubs each of a different style. One is of the bird-headed type and was acquired in 1896 from Mrs Duthie who was part of the Duthie shipbuilding family who were at that time associated with Cairnbulg Castle. Another club has a mushroom shaped head, and the third is shorter for throwing.

Two decorated shells also come from New Caledonia. They are each illustrated with a man's head and one is smoking a pipe. This type of shell is often attributed to French convicts imprisoned in New Caledonia and date from the late 19<sup>th</sup> century. They were collected by the Countess of Kintore, Lady Sydney Charlotte (1851-1932).
